

Former Military Vehicles and Weapons display at Arlington 2008 Fly-In will be largest ever in Pacific Northwest



A complete army/marine encampment will be raised adjacent to former military aircraft at the July 9-13 2008 Arlington Fly-In & Air Show. Over 100 vehicles from WWII, Korea and Vietnam eras will be on display. Several large displays include combat equipment including weapons used by US and foreign services.



Members of the Puget Sound Military Vehicle Collectors Club will be on hand to share information about the history and purpose of the many vehicle and weapon types. The organization is dedicated to the support of our military services and to inform the public about the history and purpose of the many vehicle types represented.



Visitors to the encampment located at the western part of the air show venue will see jeeps, scout cars, half-track, large trucks, mechanical mules, ambulances, a tank, anti-tank cannons and more. A traveling military history museum displays a wide variety of small arms weapons including pistols, rifles, machineguns, mortars and rocket launchers.

Military veterans and active service members are encouraged to bring family and friends to the display area to share their experiences using the displayed equipment. During the Veterans appreciation day, Sunday July 13, veterans will be invited to ride with parade vehicles.
